Tracy Orr reported that we received two more grants. One from New Mexico Clean and Beautiful for \$2,200. We had asked for \$4,500 however, NMC&B received less funding to go around this year. \$2,200 will be enough for us to do what we've done in the past.

The second grant we received was the Municipal Arterial Program (MAP) for Camino Grande. In our application, we asked for \$592,111, which was \$444,084 from NMDOT and \$148,028 as our match. We received \$274,712, with \$206,034 in MAP funds with \$68,678 in match funds. We will be applying for a match waiver for this grant.

A RESOLUTION 2017-26 AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE NMDOT FY18 COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$44,815 FOR RECONSTRUCTION ON TAOS DRIVE

WHEREAS, the Village of Angel Fire received an agreement from New Mexico Department of Transportation in the amount of \$44,815 to reconstruct 2000 feet of roadway on Taos Drive; and

WHEREAS, NMDOT is responsible for 75% percent of the total grant amount, which is \$33,611; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Angel Fire agrees to pay 25% of the total grant amount, which is \$11,204; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Angel Fire will not be applying for a match waiver for this project due to the Village applying for a match waiver for MAP: and

WHEREAS, the Village of Angel Fire believes it is in the best interest of all of its Citizens to participate in this agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Angel Fire has agreed to assume ownership, liability and continued maintenance responsibility for these roads.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Village of Angel Fire that the Mayor of said Village is authorized to sign the agreement to request these funds.

RESOLUTION 2017-27

VILLAGE OF ANGEL FIRE

PARTICIPATION IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT ROAD FUND HARDSHIP MATCH WAIVER PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR PROJECT NO. MAP-7507(903) AND CONTROL NO. L400318

WHEREAS, the Village of Angel Fire and the New Mexico Department of Transportation have entered into a joint and coordinated effort, and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the project will be <u>\$274,712</u> to be funded in proportional share by the parties hereto as follows:

a. New Mexico Department of Transportation's share shall be 75% or \$206,034

and

b. The Village of Angel Fire's proportional matching share shall be 25% or \$68,678

TOTAL PROJECT COST IS \$274,712

Village of Angel Fire shall pay all costs, which exceed the total amount of \$68,678.

WHEREAS, NMAC 27.3.8 allows Public Entities who are experiencing financial hardship to apply for a Match Waiver of all or part of the above mentioned Public Entity match.

WHEREAS, the <u>Village of Angel Fire</u> qualifies for the Match Waiver because the Village has had a number of financial setbacks recently which has resulted in a lack of funds available for road projects such as this one. In addition, the Village of Angel Fire needs to use available funds for significant improvements to our water/waste water treatment plant and road infrastructure.

Now therefore, be it resolved in official session that <u>Village of Angel Fire</u> determines, resolves, and orders as follows:

That <u>Village of Angel Fire</u> requests a Match Waiver in the amount of <u>\$68,678</u> for LGRF Project for year 2017 - 2018 to plan, design, construction management, construction, reconstruction, pavement rehab, drainage, and miscellaneous improvements to Camino Grande, Phase II within the control of the <u>Village of Angel Fire</u> in <u>Angel Fire/Colfax</u>, New Mexico.
